

NCCBG Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update: 05.07.20



Executive Director Update - May 7, 2020 Coronavirus Information

Good afternoon,

Our positive trends are continuing. 6,800 tests were administered yesterday, with an increase of 639 confirmed cases, bringing the total number of confirmed cases to 13,397. Hospitalizations rose by 9 to 525, and the death toll broke 500.

The next two weeks will be critical. We need to continue this stability in order to reopen after May 22nd. In the meantime, continue to work on your reopening protocols. We've provided numerous articles to assist you, and as we learn more from NCDHHS we will be publishing that as well.

In other headlines....

NCDOR Eases Restriction on Destroying Unsaleable Malt Beverages:

NCDOR is providing alternative means for you to qualify for the major disaster exemption on malt beverages rendered unsaleable. The <u>notice posted by NCDOR</u> provides the new procedures and links to the appropriate forms. Caveat: *Document everything and keep good records.*

The Ever Changing Face of PPP and EIDL:

Yesterday the SBA revised their <u>Paycheck Protection Program FAQs</u> again. Two key changes: One extends by a week to May 14th the ability to return unneeded PPP loan funds to avoid government interference. The second relates to loan forgiveness. Specifically, question 40 of the FAQs:

40. Will a borrower's PPP loan forgiveness amount (pursuant to section 1106 of the CARES Act and SBA's implementing rules and guidance) be reduced if the borrower laid off an employee, offered to rehire the same employee, but the employee declined the offer?

Answer: No. As an exercise of the Administrator's and the Secretary's authority under Section 1106(d)(6) of the CARES Act to prescribe regulations granting de minimis exemptions from the Act's limits on loan forgiveness, SBA and Treasury intend to issue an interim final rule excluding laid-off employees whom the borrower offered to rehire (for the same salary/wages and same number of hours) from the CARES Act's loan forgiveness reduction calculation. The interim final rule will specify that, to qualify for this exception, the borrower must have made a good faith, written offer of rehire, and the employee's rejection of that offer must be documented by the borrower. Employees and employers should be aware that employees who reject offers of re-employment may forfeit eligibility for continued unemployment compensation.

Separately... The Washington Post is reporting that EIDL loans are now being limited to \$150,000 (versus the original \$2 million limit.) SBA has not publicized this yet.

Other news and information:

From CDC: Well sort of from the CDC. Associated Press broke a <u>story today</u> about the
White House Administration shelving a CDC site-specific guide for a phased reopening of
schools, restaurants & bars, camps, churches, day care centers and other institutions.
